OLOMOUC AS A FAVOURITE FILM LOCATION

A beautiful historic centre, many monuments, romantic streets and an unmistakable genius loci. All this lures not only tourists but also filmmakers. The city of Olomouc thus moves to different periods of time and experiences ordinary human stories as well as dramatic clashes and moments full of tension.

Olomouc has already hosted several epic film shootings. For example, the international co-production film **Doctor Zhivago** was shot here starring Keira Knightley. The space in front of the Saint Wenceslas Cathedral was used by filmmakers for the shooting of the Czech film **The Last Escape of Jerome of Prague** with Ondřej Vetchý.

Do you know the mysterious Shades (Stínadla)? Olomouc served as their backdrop even twice.

In the 1969 black-and-white **Mystery of the Conundrum** series and in the 1993 feature film of the same name. A few years ago, an impressive metal sculpture of a space **Alien** appeared on a house in Šemberova Street in the city centre (photo from the cover). H.R. Giger, a biomechanical surrealist sculptor, and the owner of the house used this sculpture as a sign of the "**Krátký film Praha**" film production company's office.

In recent years, however, Olomouc has been teeming with detectives and criminals. The city was especially popular with the creators of **Czech crime series**. A Case of the Exorcist, Blue Shadows, Five Dead Dogs, Water Goblin or Live Targets, as well as several episodes of the **Cops and Robbers** series were filmed here.

Follow in the footsteps of these and other films and series and see the film locations of Czech and foreign crews.

Nobel Prize for Literature (the novel)

The novel Doctor Zhivago earned its author, Boris Pasternak, the Nobel Prize for Literature, an event that enraged the Soviet regime and forced him to decline the award. Both the book and the magnificent film depict the life story of a doctor with the soul of a poet in the most dramatic period of modern Russian history. This international co-production has been the most significant filmmaking effort in Olomouc so far. Real movie stars such as Keira Knightley, Hans Matheson or Sam Neill gathered here and hundreds of extras from Olomouc also got their chance.

Most of the urban scenes taking place in Paris and Moscow were shot here. For this, director Giacomo Campiotti used the Bezruč Park, Žerotínovo Square, Wurmova Street and, due to the similarity with wide Moscow boulevards, also the Svobody Street.

beloved Constance. Filmmakers like to choose Olomouc for two reasons. On camera, it looks like a real European metropolis, and yet the filming here is not that expensive. At the request of director Sergey Zhigunov, Olomouc was transformed into Paris of the 17th century.

A large part of the exterior scenes was filmed here and the famous characters Athos, Porthos, Aramis and D'Artagnan walked through the historic centre. You could meet them in Univerzitní Street or Žerotínovo Square.



ŽEROTÍNOVO SQUARE tourism.olomouc.eu

This square is located on the highest of the three Olomouc hills. It got its name from the lords of Žerotín who built a Renaissance palace around 1610 at the corner of Panská and Purkrabská Streets. Come and experience for yourself the historical atmosphere of the Michael's hill where you will also find the St. Michael's Church, one of the landmarks of the city.

The story takes place in 1992, half a year before the division of Czechoslovakia. The young detective Richard Krauz investigates a new case connected to the crimes of the former StB secret police. He sets out to find the man to whom all clues lead - the specialist in "ultimate" interrogations - the Red Captain. But he is not the only one looking for him. The filmmakers placed part of the investigation in Olomouc, specifically on Dolní Square near the Marian Plague Column opposite the historic Masné krámy houses. That is why we are even more pleased with the success the film has achieved in Czechia. Slovakia, and Estonia.

MARIAN PLAGUE COLUMN tourism olomouc.eu

The Marian Plague Column is a dominant feature of Dolní Square. It was built according to the design of stonemason Wenzl Render after the plague that struck Olomouc in the years 1713-1715. The column is decorated with statues of eight saints and an oval opening in the lower part. It is ideal for taking a non-traditional photo of the historic city centre.

A number of well-known Czech actors and many of their German colleagues took part in the filming. The film crew also worked in Olomouc nearby the Saint Wenceslas Cathedral on Wenceslas and Žerotínovo Square where scenes from 17th century France were filmed. It was at that time that the field of professional handwriting analysis was created.

Visit one of the three Olomouc hills. Here you will find the remains of the Přemyslid Castle and the Bishop's Palace, the early Gothic rectorate Church of St. Anne and the Baroque Chapel of St. Barbara in a Romanesque round tower. The Archdiocesan Museum hides further beauties – statues, religious objects, a picture gallery full of valuable works and an ornate ceremonial carriage. The clear landmark of the whole place, however, is the St. Wenceslas Cathedral.

They were based on a novel by Michal Sýkora, a teacher of Anglo-American literature at the Palacký University in Olomouc. Therefore, it is not surprising that the name of the series was inspired by an important Olomouc landmark – the Holy Trinity Column. The team of investigators is located right next to it.



FESTIVE FRESCO HALL - KOMENIUM SCHOOL tourism.olomouc.eu

The Komenium building was built between 1873 and 1875 with the purpose to increase the prestige of education in Olomouc and it still serves as a primary school and kindergarten. However, the hall with its rich decorations on all the walls and the ceiling gets the most attention. Painters covered the hall with allegorical and mythological scenes in Neo-Renaissance and Baroque style.



HORNÍ SQUARE, HOLY TRINITY COLUMN tourism.olomouc.eu

The Holy Trinity Column, one of the symbols of Olomouc, was added to the UNESCO World Cultural and Natural Heritage List in 2000. It is the largest ever grouping of Baroque statues within a single sculpture in Central Europe. You can't miss it when visiting the city centre.

The Czech Lion Awards – Best TV Movie or Miniseries (NOMINATED)

A team of police officers investigates a murder linked to an exorcism ritual. It was filmed on the Horní and Dolní Squares where Olomouc residents could meet famous actors on the street or in a restaurant. The silo in Polská Street, i.e. the so-called villa on the silo, also served as a backdrop for the series. The villa is a modern architectural gem which even boasts the Best Family House award from the Grand Prix Architects competition.

LIVE TARGETS 64 % CSEP Rating

A team of detectives solves the case of a serial killer who is murdering former classmates. During the filming, you could meet actors or the famous director Jan Hřebejk near the District Attorney's Office, on Horní Square near the Hercules fountain, on the Republiky Square or at the Metropol cinema. It was also filmed at the Palacký University Arts Centre.

BLUE SHADOWS

The Czech Lion Awards - Best TV Movie or Miniseries (NOMINATED)

The detectives work on a case of a docent who got shot right on the grounds of the Palacký University in Olomouc. They are trying to find out whether the murder is related to the victim's attempt to dismiss the university's bursar due to strange machinations during the reconstruction of a historic university building. This detective series was filmed for the most part directly in the premises of the ancient buildings of the University of Olomouc.



WATER GOBLIN

The Czech Lion Awards – Best TV Movie or Miniseries (WON)

The main character investigates on her own an incomprehensible murder of a small child which took place on the outskirts of Olomouc 25 years ago. The story takes place on two time levels – at the end of the 1980s and in the present. The filmmakers showed the Church of St. Michael, the District Attorney's Office, and the Kosinova Street.

FIVE DEAD DOGS 66 %

The film takes you into the world of dog fighting and animal smuggling. The mysterious disappearance of three bears develops into a complicated story full of illegal trade in animals, their abuse, and even murderous attacks. The filmmakers were looking for places that architecturally correspond to the second half of the 1930s. They chose, among others, Kollárovo and Žerotínovo Square, Villa Primavesi, Školní Street and Palacký University.

The Art Nouveau villa was built as a city residence of the Otto and Eugenia Primavesi banking family. It is located in a garden above the city walls, and you can have a good look at it while walking in the Bezruč Park. The building is sensitively integrated into the historical core of the city and the interior decoration was done by leading artists of the time.

The cathedral, also called the dome, had been originally a Romanesque basilica from the first half of the 12th century, but it was rebuilt several times. At the end of the 19th century, the dome underwent reconstruction in the neo-Gothic style which gave it its current appearance. It has been a national cultural monument since 1995.

Probably the most memorable scene for Olomouc residents was the narrative scene in Pekařská Street which in the story formed the border, the so-called Splitting Street, between two quarters – the gloomy Shades (Stínadla) and the Other Side. In the real Olomouc, you can find it halfway between two important churches, the Church of the Virgin Mary of the Snow, and the Church of St. Maurice. Here you can step into the narrow Vodární Street, the legendary Shades (Stínadla).

The film was shot in Olomouc among other places. The scene of the guillotine execution takes place on the Michael's Hill near the Church of St. Michael.

The church was built on the foundations of a Gothic temple from 1251 which was destroyed during the Swedish wars. Starting in 1676, two Italian architects took part in its construction, and thus it became the first domed building of the Northern Italian type in Moravia. In the years 1892–1898, the church underwent a Neo-Baroque restoration and is still one of the landmarks of Olomouc.

One of the most famous films of the 1960s was based on Milan Kundera's novel of the same name. Ludvík Jahn, a student, sends his girlfriend the "cursed" postcard with his text: "Optimism is the opium of mankind! A healthy spirit stinks of stupidity! Long live Trotsky!" In the 1950s, the consequences won't be long in coming and Ludvík is sent to a penal labour camp known for extremely harsh treatment. Years later, the protagonist, severely affected by Stalinist repressions, tries to take revenge.

The part of the film where Ludvík sends the postcard was filmed in Olomouc. Here you can see the Astronomical Clock which can be found on Horní Square.

ASTRONOMICAL CLOCK

The Clock is set into the northern facade of the Town Hall and reaches a height of 14 meters. The present-day appearance reflects the socialist realism style of the 1950s when it was created according to the design of Karel Svolinský. The mosaic decoration depicts period motifs. Every day at noon, the figures of proletarians start to move.

The Olomouc author of literary fiction and co-author of screenplays, Michal Sýkora, found common ground again with screenwriter Petr Jarchovský and director Jan Hřebejk and together they created this four-part series.

The story takes place at a university and was filmed in Petráš Palace, Konvikt and elsewhere in Olomouc. Relationships between men and women, echoes of the #MeToo campaign, aggressive feminism and gender issues play a role in the story.

The characters Vojtěch and Soňa are siblings, and both teach at the Palacký University in Olomouc. Vojta writes detective stories and Soňa gets inspired by him. She publishes a very successful erotic novel. Ambitious Alice is elected to the position of dean of the Faculty of Philosophy, and she is determined to eradicate all manifestations of sexist stereotypes at the school. The situation at the university escalates when a sexually motivated murder of a female student occurs.

PETRÁŠ PALACE tourism.olomouc.eu

The original Gothic core of the palace was rebuilt in the Renaissance style in the second half of the 16th century. A Baroque reconstruction took place in the years 1725–1734. The palace gradually belonged to noble families from Vrbno, Żerotin, Zvole and others. In the years 1746–1751, it was the seat of the first learned society in the Habsburg Monarchy which was founded by the poet Josef Petráš. Since 2001, the National Heritage Institute has been seated here.

THE CHURCH OF THE VIRGIN MARY OF THE SNOW

The Church of the Virgin Mary of the Snow on the Republic Square is currently the church of the Roman Catholic Academic Parish of Olomouc. It was built by the Jesuits in the years 1712-1722 as a university church in the High Baroque style on the site of an original Gothic church. Before the arrival of the Jesuits, it was part of the Minorite monastery.

The film was shot at the Olomouc University Hospital in the Franz Josef's building which was intended for demolition at that time. The film was made under the patronage of the Archbishopric of Olomouc.

The story is about the fate of two students at the University of Olomouc, Robert Vrba and Alfred Waltzer, who escaped from the Auschwitz extermination camp in April 1944. They wrote a 32-page report about their experiences, which reached the Vatican, the Pope, President Roosevelt, Prime Minister Churchill, and journalists. Unfortunately, no one responded to their message.

The filmmakers chose the premises of the Armoury, today the Library of the Palacký University, and a stop on Hrdinů Square near the Hussite church. In 2020, the story of the two students turned into a very successful film in a Slovak-Czech-German co-production under the title The Auschwitz Report.

HUSSITE CHURCH

The building by architect Hubert Aust combines elements of functionalism, antiquity, and Byzantine style. The church was ceremoniously opened in 1926, and Olomouc thus became the seat of the Moravian-Silesian diocese. The building assumed the role of a diocesan cathedral and remains so to this day.

The construction of the pavilion began in June 1894 and in 1896 it was solemnly consecrated. It was the oldest pavilion on the grounds of the University Hospital and named after the then Habsburg monarch. In 2023, this pavilion was demolished to be replaced by a new, modern building.

Marek Mičke, a film enthusiast. launched an amazing and remarkable project a few years ago. On his

Facebook account named "Film Frame" (Filmové políčko), he publishes photos of film locations. You can see the most famous movie locations and compare how the place looked in the movie and how it looks today.

Mark. how did it all start and what do you enjoy so much about this hobby?

I always enjoyed visiting movie locations. I noticed that it is a favourite pastime for many Czechs as they can combine a trip with a visit to a movie location. It's the same for me. I came across this concept abroad and

thought it would be nice to transfer it to our countries. But I didn't just want to copy, that's why I also make videos about film locations and take historical photos. And what I enjoy most is taking a trip with my family to the photo location.

How do you choose the locations you visit? What brought you to Olomouc?

I always prefer locations of my favourite movies. I wouldn't photograph something I haven't seen. I get the greatest enjoyment when I can photograph a scene that somehow captures my heart or is essential for the film. A lot of great things was shot in Olomouc. Besides, I really like it when I can go somewhere outside of Praque.

What places did you visit in **Olomouc? Which movies were** vou referring to?

I mostly walked around the city centre. So, of course, I was at Horní Square with the Astronomical Clock that appeared in The Joke, at Žerotínovo Square and the adjacent streets where the Cops and Robbers series were shot. I also hung around the university where the wonderful Doctor Zhivago was filmed, and I also took some photos on the May 1st Street where The Case of the Dead Man was shot. I tried to capture especially the nice places, but there are a lot of them here.

How do you rate Olomouc as a film location, did you like it here?

It's beautiful here. Since I'm from Prague, I was actually surprised that more films haven't been shot here and that filmmakers don't choose Olomouc as a location more often. There are beautiful spots here that are not spoiled by omnipresent advertising or of tourist crowds like in Prague.

HISTORIC **"GRANNY" TRAM** www.dpmo.cz

This beautiful tram number 223 used to run in Prague between 1930 and 1974 and then served in Olomouc as a service vehicle until 1981, Reconstructed, it went on its first ride around Olomouc in 2008. This historic "granny" tram starred in The Mystery of the Conundrum (1993) and Doctor Zhivago (2002). It still goes to the streets of Olomouc several times a year on festive occasions.

RAILWAY GEMS OF THE PAST www.cdnostalgie.cz

In the very heart of Olomouc, not far from the main train station, there is a depository and workshop of the ČD Nostalgie museum where real gems of our railway history are exhibited. Steam locomotives and machines from the recent past can be seen here. The museum also participates in film production. It prepares trains for filmmakers according to their requirements, provides professional consultations and helps with selection of locations. Machines from this museum have appeared in several films, video

clips and documentaries (e.g. Traveling with Steam). The depository opens its doors several times a year on various occasions when historical trains are also dispatched to the area around.

The museum of historic cars called Veteran Arena is the biggest private, publicly accessible museum in Czechia. On an area of 400 m², you will find exhibits from the 1930s. The heart of the exhibition is a collection of Czechoslovak Tatra, Praga, Aero, Z and Škoda cars. Foreign brands include Mercedes, BMW, and VW. In total, around 160 exhibits are on display, so the makers of period films really have a lot to choose from including unique Wikov cars made in nearby Prostěiov.

DO YOU KNOW THAT..

... the famous Czech actress **Hana Maciuchová** († 2021) started her acting career in Olomouc? She graduated from the Olomouc-Hejčín secondary school and was already involved in amateur theatre in those days. She was also a member of the Studio at the Oldřich Stibor Theatre in Olomouc (today the Moravian Theatre). She regularly and happily returned to Olomouc both for work and to see family and friends.



... the protagonists of the Czech comedy **Gentleman's Ride (2004)**, starring Martin Dejdar, Ondřej Vetchý and Josef Abrhám, had to cope without women at the Svobody Street, the market hall and Denisova Street?



... Mr. Tau went to work for the first time (1975) in Olomouc? He found a job at a local dairy in Pavelkova Street. He managed the first working day with his own charm, but for others it was a complete disaster. The family fantasy comedy **Mr. Tau (1971)** has been entertaining children for more than 50 years.



... an important role in Hermína Týrlová's animated film **The Curious Letter (1961)** is played by a mailbox placed by filmmakers on the corner of the Renaissance house At the Black Eagle on Horní Square in Olomouc? The film tells the story of a letter that desired to see the world and forgot about its timely delivery.

... the Czech comedy **The Heart full of Hopes (1985)** was also filmed in Olomouc? The heroes of the story are former friends who become archenemies not only because of their classmate Zuzana, who they both like. In the film, you can see, among other things, the Caesar fountain on Horní Square and the interiors of the ZŠ Hálkova primary school building.

... Olomouc is doubling for the beautiful European city, where the main character of the short-story drama **I Am Wandering (2010)** arrives? The city welcomes the woman four times, lets her wander in its Baroque labyrinth and experience four different stories. The actress in the lead role, Silvia Antolová, unfortunately did not see the premiere. She died of cancer at the age of 35 and the film is dedicated to her.

ACADEMIA FILM OLOMOUC

INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL OF SCIENCE DOCUMENTARY FILMS

Academia Film Olomouc (AFO), an international festival of science documentary films, ranks among the largest cinematography festivals in Czechia. The high number of accredited viewers only confirms this. The festival has been organized by the Palacký University since 1966. Originally a low-key, non-public initiative has turned into one of the **biggest educational events in Europe** over the years.

AFO focuses on the popularization of science and annually presents the best contemporary scientific films from prestigious world productions. Renowned icons of Czech and foreign science and representatives of film and television industry come to Olomouc to present them in person.

The city has already hosted scientists such as evolutionary biologist Richard Dawkins, robotics visionary Hiroshi Ishiguro or AI philosopher Susan Schneider. Visitors can look forward to a rich festival programme presenting major shifts in scientific understanding in the form of films, documentaries, discussions, lectures, and panel debates with guests from the field of science and film industry. Viewers can delve into the secrets of distant planets, Earth's oceans, global warming, development of robotics and artificial intelligence.

Various topics discussed include the position of women in science and society, human addiction, as well as the importance of the science fiction genre for the popularisation of science.

The festival is inherently linked to the **music and entertainment programme** with its own fanbase. Performers from the world's alternative scene come to Olomouc for AFO, workshops and various competitions are held there.
